TABLE SAW SAFETY RULES

- 1. Follow all General Shop Safety Rules.
- 2. Check all stock for nails or foreign material before sawing.
- 3. Never stand directly in line with the blade. Most operators prefer to stand to the left of the blade.
- 4. Do not place the hands above, behind, or within 4" of the blade.
- 5. Never saw freehand.
- 6. Do not use the fence and miter gauge together, unless a clearance block is attached to the fence.
- 7. Do not clear away scraps with your fingers while the blade is in motion.
- 8. Use a push stick for ripping narrow stock.
- 9. Never reach over the machine to catch the stock that is cut off. Use a helper, or let the stock fall to the floor.
- 10. Use the fence for ripping; the miter gauge for crosscutting.
- 11. Use a splitter or riving knife when ripping.
- 12. Adjust the blade height so that the blade projects 1/4" to 3/8" above the stock.
- 13. Adjust the blade guard to cover the operation and hover approximately 1/4"-1/2" above the stock.
- 14. Minimum stock length is 12".
- 15. Never "cut past a square" when using the rip fence. This means that if the stock length running along the fence is 12", the maximum width of the piece should be no more than 12". A crosscut sled or miter gage should be used for cutting long, narrow pieces.
